

Department of Biomedical Engineering Graduate Program Course Registration Guidelines

1. "Seminars and Discussions" are required courses:
 - Master's Program: Students who can complete their master's degree examination (graduation) within two semesters must complete two semesters of the seminar; students in their third semester must complete three semesters; students in their fourth semester or beyond must complete four semesters.
 - Master's Professional Program: Four semesters are required.
 - Doctoral Program: Four semesters are required.
2. Note: Starting from the 109th academic year, master's and doctoral students must complete 2 credits of graduate-level general education electives to meet graduation requirements.
3. For master's and professional master's students, if you have not completed at least 3 credits each of Physiology (or related courses) and Engineering Mathematics (or related courses) during your undergraduate studies, you are required to take at least 3 credits of each of the relevant courses. If you have completed these courses, you may apply for an "exemption" (submit your undergraduate transcript for department review and approval), but you must still make up the required credits.
4. Doctoral students must take at least the following courses:
 - (1) Introduction to Medical Engineering (graduate level)
 - (2) Physiology (graduate level)
 - (3) Engineering Mathematics (undergraduate level or higher).If you have already taken these courses (at least 3 credits each), you may apply for an "exemption," but you must still make up the required credits. These exemption requests must be approved by the department.

Note: The "Physiology" and "Engineering Mathematics" courses are not offered every semester. Please plan your course schedule in advance.
5. Applications for credit exemption must be submitted during the designated period in the semester of enrollment. (For details, refer to the "Chung Yuan Christian University Guidelines for Credit Exemption Review.")
6. Please pay attention to the "Required Courses and Credits Table," as well as the "Master's Program Academic Regulations," "Professional Master's Program Academic Regulations," or "Doctoral Program Academic Regulations" of the department.
7. Before the course registration deadline, please be sure to verify your "Course Registration List". If there are any errors or omissions, please contact the department office assistant or the course offering department.
8. Students who fail to register for courses as required, resulting in delayed graduation, will be responsible for the consequences.
9. For other course registration-related regulations, please refer to the announcements from the Academic Affairs Office or the department's announcements.
